India is a party to the Vienna Convention for the Protection of the Ozone layer and the Montreal Protocol on substances that deplete the Ozone layer and all its amendment. India has been successfully implementing the phase-out program for Ozone Depleting Substances (ODSs) in the county.

The United Nations General Assembly on 23rd January, 1995 adopted resolution 49/114, which proclaims 16th September as the World Ozone Day. Commemorating the date on which Montreal Protocol on substances that deplete the Ozone layer was signed in 1987. This World Ozone Day offers an opportunity to focus global attention and action on this vital environmental issue.

The theme for the celebration of this year's World Ozone Day to be marked on 16th September is "Keep Cool and Carry On". The theme is accompanied by the tagline: The Montreal Protocol. The Montreal Protocol on substances that deplete the Ozone layer has so far been successful in phasing out of 99% of ODSs globally. As a result, the abundance of ODSs in the atmosphere is declining and a recent study has indicated that the ozone layer is recovering. Due to the significant reduction of ODSs globally and the starting of recover of the ozone layer, the Montreal Protocol has been recognized as the most successful environment treaty, globally. The Protocol has been universally ratified by all 197 member countries of United Nations.

Environmental Management & Policy Research Institute (EMPRI) celebrated the World Ozone Day on 20th September 2018.





Swachh Bharat Abhiyan (SBA) or Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) is a nation-wide campaign in India for the period 2014 to 2019 that aims to clean up the streets, roads and infrastructure of India's cities, towns, and rural areas.

The objectives of Swachh Bharat include eliminating open defecation through the construction of household-owned and community-owned toilets and establishing an accountable mechanism of monitoring toilet use. Run by the Government of India, the mission aims to achieve an "open-defecation free" (ODF) India by 2 October 2019.

As a precursor to the 150th birth anniversary celebrations of Mahatma Gandhi, and in the run up to the 4th anniversary of Swachh Bharat Mission, it has been decided to observe Swachhata Hi Seva 2018 (SHS), aims at accelerating the jan andolan for realizing the vision of a clean India, further reinforcing the that 'Sanitation is everyone's business'.
